### **Advanced Metering Infrastructure Focus of AWWA Webcast**

(DENVER, CO) – Water professionals will learn from subject matter experts about the benefits of using mobile technologies during an American Water Works Association (AWWA) webcast taking place at 1 p.m. EST on January 28.
